

7. A brief write up of the programme (with web snaps/photographs/paper cuttings):

A survey was conducted on the status of maternal and child health in the area of Durganagar Ashram, Karimganj on 29th May, 2023. The survey was organised by the Department of Economics, Karimganj College under the aegis of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Karimganj College. Altogether 61 honours students of Karimganj College conducted this survey on a total population of 346. In the survey, Dr. Ritumani Haloi, Gadapani Sarma, Hema Hazarika, Arnab Dutta Choudhury of Department of Economics and K Nirupama Singha of Department of Philosophy participated. During the survey we have visited the Duga Nagar Aashram area and interacted with the local people and realized that they are facing many problems. These problems include poor communication system, lack of clean drinking water, unemployment etc. Besides, the villager said that they are facing many problems in getting various government grants.

Methodology: The survey was conducted on a random basis. Collection of samples was done through simple random sampling. A total number of 60 households were surveyed. The family members were interviewed directly to gather the relevant informations. Information relating to Population, Education, Child health, Maternal health and other related Maternal and Child health indicators were collected. The data collected on various maternal and child health indicators were analysed and interesting results were found.

Findings of the Study: The finding of the study relating to different maternal and child health indicators of the area of Durganagar Ashram are as follows:

It has been found that there are 346 people in 60 households and thus the household size is 5.76 which is relatively high in the village. Moreover, almost 90 percent surveyed women of these people are educated. As a result, mothers and children in the region are able to access proper health care from their families. The survey shows that in the 60 households surveyed, a total of 36 children between the ages of 0 and 5 years were found. Also, it has been found that about 26 out of 36 babies were born in government hospitals. The remaining 10 were born at home and almost all the children are healthy. Out of total 36 babies, 29 have already been given all types of vaccines in government institutions and remaining 07 have given vaccine in private institutions. This means that the people of this area are aware of child health. They are aware of the ill effects of not giving vaccines to children at the right time.

The survey also shows that pregnant women within the jurisdiction of surveyed area also have access to all kinds of health facilities and services. All pregnant women were found to be educated. These women's also get enough care from the family side.

The information relating to their Demographic Profile, Children Profile and Maternal Profile has shown in the Table-1, Table-2 and Table-3 respectively.

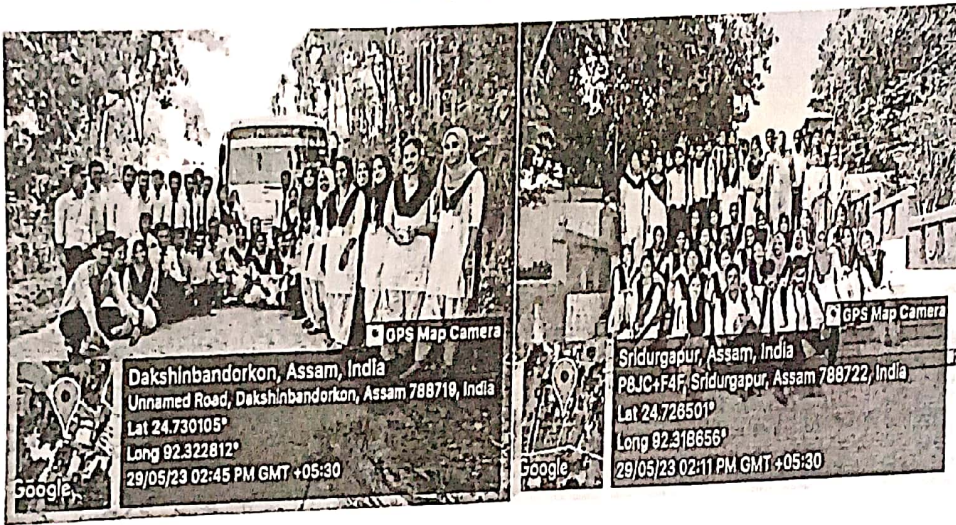

Although the literacy rate among the women within the surveyed area is 90 percent but in reality highly female educated population is very low. In addition, although most of the people in the area are health conscious and take good care of their children, the medical facilities in the area are very scarce. Most of the people rely on government health services, but the government health Centres are also located only 5/6 km away from the area, which is not accessible easily.

শতাংশ। এজন্যই পরিবারের উৎস থেকে মা ও শিশুরা পুরোপুরিভাবে স্বাস্থ্য সেবা লাভ করতে পারছেন। অথচ ল যোগাযোগ বা স্বাস্থ্য বেকারত্ব, বিতর্ক পানীয়জলের অভাব সহ বিভিন্ন সমস্যার কথা এদিনের সমীক্ষায় উঠে আসে।

৩৬ জন শিশু যাদের বয়স শূন্য থেকে পাঁচ বৎসর এবং এই সকল শিশুই সরকারি হাসপাতালে জন্ম। এই সকল শিশুর প্রত্যেকজনকে সকল রকমের প্রতিবেদক দেওয়া হয়। এতে বুঝা যায়, এই এলাকায় মানুষেরা শিশু স্বাস্থ্য সচেতন। সঠিক সময়ে শিশুদেরে প্রতিবেদক না দেওয়ার কুপ্রভাব সম্পর্কে তারা সচেতন। সমীক্ষায় এও দেখা যায় যে এই অঞ্চলের গর্ভবর্তী মেয়েরাও সকল

ধরনের যাত্রা সুবিধা ও সেবা পান। পারিবারিক দিক থেকেও এই মেয়েরা যথেষ্ট পরিচর্যা পান। এই অঞ্চলের শিক্ষার হার প্রায় ৯০ শতাংশ এবং এর ফলেই পরিবারের উন্নয়ন থেকে এই অঞ্চলের মা ও শিশু সৃষ্টি স্বাস্থ্য সেবা লাভ করতে সমর্থ হন। যোগাযোগের বারাদে দাপড়া বেকারত্ব, বিগুজ পানীয় জলের অভাব, শ্রম প্রত্যাশিত ইত্যাদি বিভিন্ন সমস্যার কথা এই সমীক্ষায় উঠে আসে। এছাড়া গ্রামবাসীরা জন্মন, বিভিন্ন সরকারি অনুদান পেতেও ওদের অনেক সমস্যা হয়। করিমগঞ্জ কলেজের সাম্মানিক স্তরের ৬১ জন ছাত্রছাত্রীরা মোট ৩৬৪ জনসংখ্যার উপর এই সমীক্ষা করে। সমীক্ষায় অর্থনৈতিক বিভাগের ড. মৃত্তমনি হালই, পানাপানি শর্মা, হেনা হাজারিকা, অর্পন দত্ত চৌধুরী, দর্শন পিঙ্গায়ে ও কে নিরুপমা সিংহ অংশ গ্রহণ করেন। সম্পূর্ণ সমীক্ষার কাজে সহযোগিতা করেন দুর্গাঙ্গণের আশ্রমের একজন সক্রিয় সদস্য পরেশ দেব।







6. A brief write up of the programme (with web snaps/photographs/paper cuttings):

A one day Educational tour was organized on 22nd March, 2023 by the History Department of Karimganj College to two historical/archaeological sites: Badarpur fort, Badarpur and Khaspur ruins located in Khaspur village in Cachar District. The tour comprised of 20 honours students belonging to different semesters along with three faculties, Asst. Professor Md Shakir Hussain Choudhury (HOD), Asst. Professor Rupali Daulagajao, and Guest Lecturer Pratap Ranjan Das from the Dept. of History. All the students and faculties gathered at College campus by 9 am and started the journey at 9:30 am by bus.



We arrived at our first destination i.e., the Badarpur Fort at 10:05 am which was located on the bank of the river Barak. After reaching the site and having a tour of it, Shakir sir and Pratap sir explained to us about the historical and archaeological significance of the fort. Built during the Medieval period, the structure has an Islamic feature. The fort is still standing upright, but it is semi-ruined due to negligence. The site is yet to be included as a protected monument under Archaeological Survey of India.

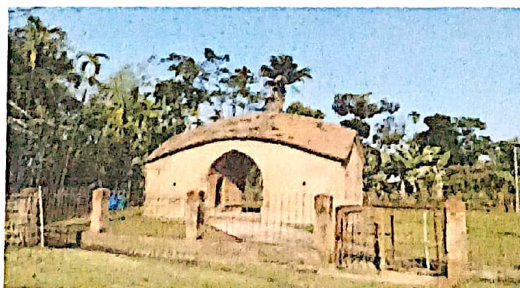


After staying there for 45 minutes, we left for our journey towards Khaspur. On the way, we stopped at the Marwari Dhaba of Ramnagar (near Silchar) to have breakfast. After completing our breakfast, we again started our journey towards Silchar for Kashpur ruins and finally reached the ruins at 12:50 pm.

Before exploring the ruins, Rupali ma'am highlighted to us the historical background and archaeological significance of the site, and Shakir sir briefed on the important causes responsible for the settlement in that area. The ruins comprised of Vishnu and Shiva temples, Baradwari, Singha darwaza (Lion Gate), Ranachandi temple, small unfinished dwelling house, and Snan Mandir built by the rulers of the Kachari kingdom in the late medieval period. All these monuments have been declared to be of national importance under the Ancient Monument and Archaeological sites Act of 1958. Except for the Snan Mandir and the incomplete dwelling house, all the structures have similar roof design that is do-chala style. The Vishnu and Shiva temples have floral and geometric designs on its walls with multi foliated arches on the opening doors as well as artificial doors. Baradwari is the only double storeyed building to be found in the site. The edifice is square in plan having twelve openings; doorways have multi foliated arches which shows the influence of Islamic architecture. The structure is slightly tilted and in a dilapidated condition. Snan Mandir is square in plan with a domical shikara. Located on the erstwhile river bank, it is assumed that the temple was used for ceremonial bath of the deities on religious occasions.

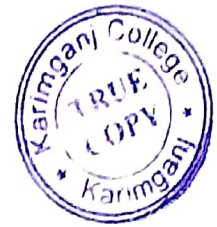

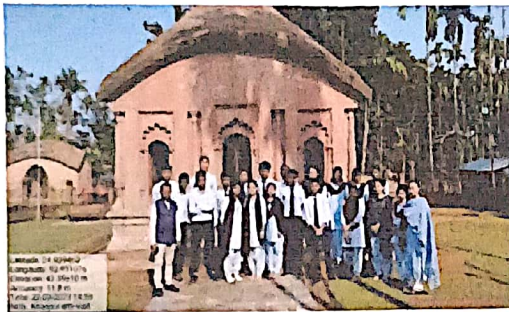
